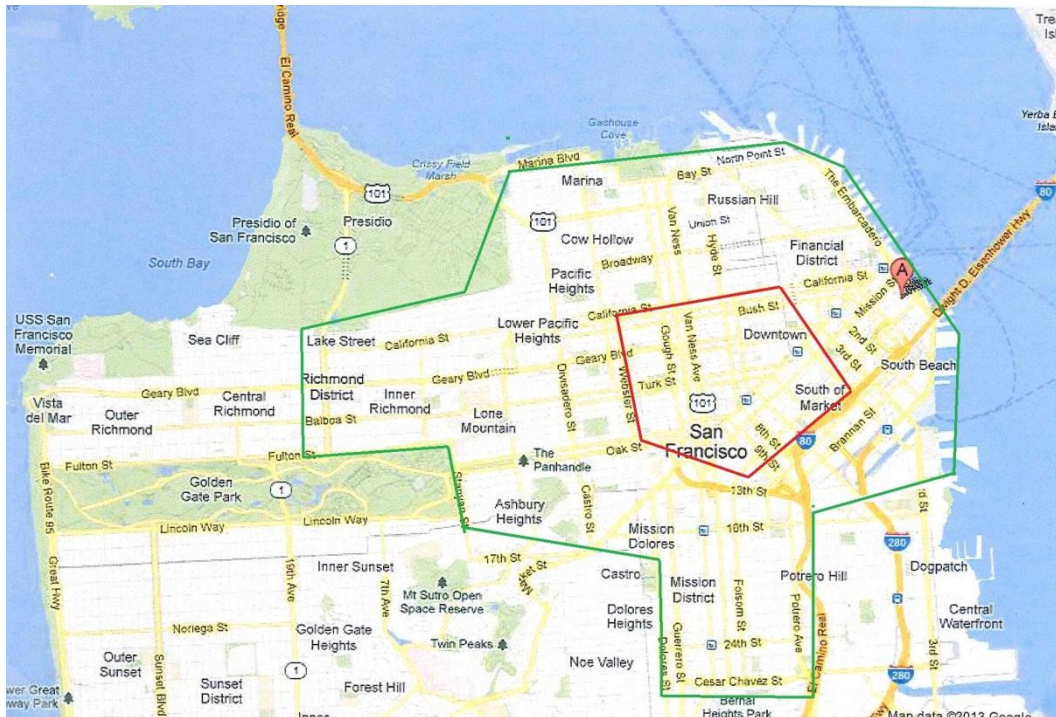


San Francisco Housing Options

Welcome to San Francisco! We understand that finding reasonably priced, good housing options can be a difficult endeavor in San Francisco. We wanted to give you a map to show you what neighborhoods we recommend living in while you are studying here in San Francisco. We encourage you to find housing within the green lines, and we do not recommend that you choose housing within the red lines. Your classes will be held at 101 Howard Street in the Financial District, which is marked by the letter "A" on the map. In addition, below is a list of websites that rent short-term housing. We highly suggest that you do not sign a year-long lease, but keep in mind short-term rentals are difficult to find, so you may want to start searching immediately.



San Francisco is an extremely expensive city to live in. Downtown is one of the more expensive areas, and two bedroom apartments range from \$3,000-\$5,500 per month. The Richmond district offers cheaper rent, with two bedroom apartments ranging from \$2,000-\$4,000 per month; however you will need to factor in a longer commute to get to class. For less expensive rent, we recommend living with each other and perhaps getting a larger apartment so that you may find rent under \$1,000 per person per month. **(Please note that the following websites may have varying reviews and are not affiliated with USF.)**
